

St. Augustine School aids Haitian Earthquake victims

The more than 200 students and staff members of St. Augustine School are raising money to support The House of Grace Catholic Worker House in Philadelphia in response to the 7.0 magnitude earthquake that struck the Haitian capital of Port-au-Prince on Jan. 12. NBC-4 TV has estimated that 200,000 people may have died as a result of the catastrophe.

Sister Gloria Agumagu, HHCJ, principal of St. Augustine School, has asked St. Augustine students to bring at least \$2.00 to support The House of Grace Catholic Worker House, which runs the Clinic St. Michel (Klinik Sen Michel) in Haiti. All money raised will go to benefit the Haitian people through the purchase of bandages, analgesics, antibiotics, ointments, antiseptics and other supplies.
